Senator Lieberman Lost at Sea -

As Public Unites Against Broadwater

Farmingdale, NY-Broadwater has generated a massive outcry of public opposition. Elected officials from all levels of government, in both New York and Connecticut, have pledged to fight the massive offshore liquefied natural gas facility-except for one. Is Senator Lieberman lost at sea?

In Connecticut, Senator Dodd, Congresswoman DeLauro, Congressman Shays, and Congressman Simmons are opposed to the ill-fated facility. In New York, Senator Clinton, Senator Schumer, Congressman Bishop, and Congressman Israel have said that this project is detrimental to Long Island Sound. Where is Senator Lieberman?

Throughout New York and Connecticut there are over a 100 elected officials that have pledged to fight Broadwater, counties and towns have passed resolutions of opposition, hired legal counsel, and submitted letters and statements to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) saying "No Broadwater". Over 50,000 signatures of members of public have been submitted to FERC opposing Broadwater. And still Lieberman is silent.

"Senator Lieberman's silence clearly does not illustrate strong leadership," stated Adrienne Esposito, Executive Director, Citizens Campaign for the Environment, "The public has made their voice loud and clear-No Broadwater. Elected officials have united to stop Broadwater. Now, is time for Senator Lieberman to join the fight."
